Main Duties

- To contribute to academic teaching within the Department, drawing on one's own area of specialism to design teaching sessions which maximise the integration of theory to practice and includes module leadership and supporting students in placement. Opportunity for course leadership.

Selection methods:

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to a formal panel interview, and also asked to deliver a teaching session to the following brief:

Please deliver a 20 minute teaching session to a small group of Level 5 students. You are asked to teach the students Tendon Rehabilitation (at any stage of the rehabilitation process you wish) drawing from the current evidence-base. The students have undertaken examination and assessment, general rehabilitation and anatomy before this session. You will have access to a computer and data projector, plinths, space and a small group of second year students. Please let us know if you require any other resources.

This will be followed by 5 minutes of questions.

You will be given time after the teaching session to change clothes if required for the formal interview.

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
