4.	Adaptable, flexible and willing to embrace change and innovation, particularly in exploring the capacity of new tools and technologies to deliver traditional library services and information skills and developing teaching methods and information management beyond traditional academic boundaries. 5.	Commitment to engaging with customer feedback and continuously improving services.	Essential	Supporting Statement / Interview
6.	Ability to collaborate and build strong relationships effectively and proactively, engaging with a wide range of people both internal and external to the institution, including students, academic and professional services staff, and members of the public, with awareness/sensitivity to their varying needs. 7.	Ability to clearly communicate information e.g. via written reports, oral or poster presentations, or published articles.	Essential	Supporting Statement / Interview

- Application Form assessed against the application form and where appropriate, curriculum vitae. Applicants will not be asked to answer a specific supporting statement. Normally used to evaluate factual evidence e.g. award of a qualification. Will be "scored" as part of the shortlisting process.
- Supporting Statements applicants are asked to provide a statement to demonstrate how they meet the criteria.
 The response will be "scored" as part of the shortlisting process.
- Interview assessed during the interview process by either competency based interview questions, tests, work-related exercise, presentation or teaching session etc.
