## Main Duties\*:

- 1. To provide Problem-based Learning (PBL) Facilitation and / or Integrated Clinical Methods Facilitation (ICM clinical communication skills and basic physical examination techniques) within small group facilitation in person and / or online if required.
- 2. To use the appropriate teaching, learning support and assessment methods.
- 3. To assess the progress of students both formatively and summatively, with reference to the assessment criteria and provide constructive and timely feedback to students.
- 4. To undertake the necessary preparation for facilitating the learning sessions, including introductory training, and reading of documentation (Facilitators' Notes).
- 5. To contribute to PBL/ICM scenario refreshment, simulated patient (SP) training, and the tutor notes.
- 6. To provide student guidance, mentorship, and pastoral support as a Personal Academic Tutor (PAT) (if taking on a PBL Facilitator role).
- 7. To contribute to the quality assurance processes and the evaluation of the MBChB programme.
- 8. To attend pertinent staff development and in house training activities as required by the role including PAT and take part in peer teaching observation and dialogue.
- 9. To engage in scholarly practice.
