Main Duties

- To participate in the delivery of a range of Cricket Coaching and Management modules and contribute to other programmes as appropriate/required e.g. Sports Development and Coaching.

- 5. To contribute to the assessment process for students including the setting, marking and moderation of work, individually or collectively as part of a team in accordance with quality assurance procedures.
- 6. To ensure that teaching is informed by contemporary research and where appropriate scholarly activity that supports the development of student's critical discourse and rational thinking.
- Where appropriate undertake or contribute to consultancy and knowledge transfer work, including income generation.
