- 4. To advise and contribute to development of academic content of modules and the Nutrition and Dietetics courses.
- 5. To carry out academic administrative work and participate in relevant committees within the School, College and University.
- 6. To develop and deliver high quality learning and teaching for dietetics and other allied health students at all levels, including face-to-face, online and practical teaching and assessment as required.
- 7. To contribute to the effective and appropriate assessment processes for students including the setting, marking and moderation of student work (theoretical and practical), individually or collectively as part of a module team in accordance with quality assurance procedures.
- 8. To carry out innovative and inspiring learning modules including, enhanced online learning approaches.

- 9. To support and contribute to practice education as requested by the Practice Education Lead / Team and / or nominee.
- 10. To engage in research and scholarly activity that underpins practice, and which contributes to the University and School objectives ensuring up-to-date, leading-edge teaching.
- 11. To support dietetic students' academic progression as a Personal Academic Tutor, module leader including maintaining records, for a group and / or individual students as required in order to support students.
- 12. To participate in recruitment and selection activities.
- 13. To undertake any other reasonable duties requested by the Head of Department or nominee.
- 14. Maintain personal and professional development to meet the changing demands of the job; participate in appropriate training activities and encourage and support staff in their development and training.

## **Selection methods:**
