- 7. Engage in research and / or scholarly activity in pharmaceutics, pharmaceutical technology, or pharmacy education.
- 8. Contribute to the strategic development of the School and its academic portfolio.
- 9. To contribute to learning and teaching on Doctoral, Masters and Undergraduate courses within the School as appropriate.
- 10. Represent the School at national and international forums related to pharmacy science.
- 11. Contribute to the wider strategic development of the School and University.

Teaching session:

Please facilitate a 30-minute interactive teaching session on a pharmaceutics topic of your choice, suitable for Level 4 undergraduate MPharm students.

For the purposes of this teaching session, you should assume the audience are Level 4 undergraduate students.

Please note, the presentation and teaching session will take place on campus on Day 1 of the selection process, with successful candidates at that stage progressing to the formal panel interview on Day 2.
