Main Duties*: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Responsible for the design and delivery of teaching material across a range of modules, contributing to curriculum development across two years of the MSc PA Course. 2. Deliver theoretical teaching, practical sessions and related activities drawing on your clinical area of expertise. You will have specific MSc PA module teaching responsibilities and with experience take on module leadership. 3. Facilitate the recruitment and support of clinical placements including the relevant documentation alongside the Placement Lead. 4. Contribute to the development of activities relating to professional practice, including but not limited to clinical skills, simulation including GP consultations, and application of theory. 5. To act as a Personal Academic Tutor for PA students and undertake tutorial responsibilities, including maintaining records, for a group and / or individual students. 6. To contribute to the assessment process for all students including the setting, marking and moderation of work, individually or collectively as part of a team in accordance with quality assurance procedures. 7. To supervise dissertation work as appropriate. 8. To carry out academic administrative work and participate in relevant committees within the School and University. 9. To participate in annual staff development and review processes. 10. To participate fully in the life of the School, College and University, by engaging in representational and ambassadorial activities in support of the School's activities and carry out any other reasonable duties as requested by the Head of School.
