Main Duties*: 1. To undertake learning, teaching and assessment activities at undergraduate and postgraduate level, including: the design and development of innovative and inspiring learning materials; supervision of student dissertations; setting, marking and moderation of student work. 2. To support students and workplace clinical supervisors in the development of clinical competence in practice where necessary. 3. To participate fully in curriculum development work as required including planning, development and evaluation of courses. 4. To fulfil a highly effective personal academic tutor role, actively contributing to the process of monitoring and supporting students across the Department. 5. To carry out administrative work and participate in relevant committees within the School and University. 6. To act as a module leader and course leader on either undergraduate or postgraduate courses in the department as opportunities arise. 7. To engage in personal and professional development, including active engagement in research, scholarship, CPD and / or professional practice. 8. To participate in student recruitment and marketing of courses within the department, by engaging in shortlisting, interviews open events, taster sessions and outreach work. 9. To carry out any other reasonable duties as requested by the Head of Department, Deputy Head or Head of School. 10. Maintain personal and professional development to meet the changing demands of the job; participate in appropriate training activities and encourage and support staff in their development and training.	

11. Take steps to ensure and enhance personal health, safety, and well-being and that of other staff and students.
12. Carry out these duties in a manner that promotes equality of opportunity and supports diversity and inclusion, that supports the University's duty to secure and promote freedom of speech within the law and takes into account the University's commitment to environmentally sustainable ways of working.

Selection methods:

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to a formal panel interview and asked to deliver a 20-minute teaching session on a Cognitive Behavioural Therapy-related topic.

The session should actively demonstrate their ability to provide inspiring, interactive, and research-informed teaching, rather than describe how they would approach teaching the topic. Candidates should deliver the session as though the panel were learners, incorporating appropriate teaching and engagement strategies.
