Main Duties*: 1. To undertake the full range of teaching, course / module leadership, workplace assessment and related duties, with due regard to quality assurance and professional conduct. 2. To support the leadership in Primary Education and participate in and contribute to developments as required, including engaging in regular team meetings and wider School / UW committee work. 3. To contribute to the process of monitoring and profiling students' developing profile for gaining QTS and to fulfil a personal academic tutor role. 4. To contribute actively to planning, developing and delivering courses and new provision within your specialism, including postgraduate professional development courses for practitioners. 5. To conduct individual or collaborative practice-based research which will inform your teaching and knowledge base as well as educational practice. 6. To participate in, and contribute to, procedural and administrative aspects of the courses, such as student selection, open days, exam' boards and course and resource management. 7. To work in partnership with external agencies including, for example, national, regional, and local bodies such as Ofsted, Local Authorities, DfE, professional bodies, MATs, schools and subject associations. 8. To write and contribute to academic / professional publications, materials and papers, or using other appropriate media to disseminate. This may include delivering presentations at conferences, team and IoE events. 9. To work collaboratively as part of a team and deputise as appropriate for the Head of Department in matters related to areas of expertise.	

10. Maintain personal and professional development to meet the changing demands of the job; participate in appropriate training activities and encourage and support staff in their development and training.
11. Take steps to ensure and enhance personal health, safety, and well-being and that of other staff and students.
12. Carry out these duties in a manner that promotes equality of opportunity and supports diversity and inclusion and takes into account the University's commitment to environmentally sustainable ways of working.

Selection methods:

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to a formal panel interview, and also asked to deliver a teaching session to the following brief:

Choose an aspect of English or Mathematics which you think is key for a teacher education and training programme. Lead a 20-minute session for the panel with level 5 students where you demonstrate your own knowledge in the subject, show how you make this topic accessible and relevant for the student teachers. Relate it to pedagogical approaches and practical activities for the classroom, including inclusive practice.
